125 Questions to Ask When Researching Colleges

In this lesson you'll discover:

- 1. Questions to ask when exploring colleges and universities
- 2. Questions to include those related to COVID-19

When researching colleges, you need to make sure that you ask appropriate questions. This list will help you to do that. Too often parents and teenagers don't ask enough questions. And that is one of the reasons why a third of students attending four-year colleges end up transferring somewhere else. Many students failed to do their due diligence which would have increased their chances of making better choices.

Using this list as a guide (feel free to add and subtract questions) will require contacting these campus stakeholders:

- Admission/financial aid staffers
- Professors
- Current students
- Recent alumni
- Career office
- College administration

The college admission office should be able to connect you with recent alumni, as well as current students. I'd also recommend that during college visits, assuming they are feasible during the pandemic, stop students and engage with them.

Some of these questions you can ask during a visit. Others you can pose via email, phone calls, or Skype. Still other questions you can answer yourself through online research on websites like the federal College Navigator, COLLEGEdata, and the College Board.
